

## CALL FOR COUNTRIES

**Government MfDR officials are invited to express interest to co-lead the work on Building Country Capacity to Manage for Results under the Global Partnership on MfDR**



### **What is the Global Partnership on Managing for Development Results ?**

The Global Partnership on Managing for Development Results (MfDR) was established in the summer of 2009 as an international platform under the Working Party on Aid Effectiveness hosted at the OECD/DAC. It brings together partner countries, civil society and bilateral and multilateral donors with a view to strengthening the culture of Managing for Development Results in public sector administrations. In doing so, the Global Partnership on MfDR will:

- Document, promote and disseminate good practices in MfDR;
- Facilitate knowledge-sharing between practitioners and organizations;
- Elaborate tools that enable public administrations to demonstrate how they make use of public resources in achieving development results on the ground.

The African Development Bank, together with The Philippines, currently chairs the Global Partnership on MfDR. The Inter-American Development Bank will take over next year and chair the Partnership until the next High Level Forum on Aid Effectiveness in Korea, 2011. The Partnership is expected to meet twice per year at the OECD/DAC in Paris.

### **Co-leading the Work on Building Country Capacity to Manage for Results**

To achieve the overall objectives, one of the four tasks of the Global Partnership on MfDR is to “Implement and Learn from Capacity Development for MfDR”. The objective of this task is to support building partner country capacity for MfDR. Realistic indicative goals have been set that can be delivered with the resources available:

1. Pilot self-evaluation tools – MfDR capacity assessment/development tools are implemented by countries in support of national development plans
2. Publish/disseminate case studies on MfDR capacity assessments

The World Bank leads the task team consisting of the Asian Development Bank and Inter-American Development Bank. To broaden experiences and approaches, it is critical that a partner-country will co-lead this task until the next High Level Forum on Aid Effectiveness in October 2011.
